

east to west 400m (oval shape)


Blocks - north to south 6 streets

# Prosperity

- \* *Area under direct control of Tokugawa Shogunate during the Edo Period*
- \* *Center of Commerce, Trade & Industry in South Kawachi region  
(51 kinds of industry, 149 stores in 1668)*

# Prosperity

- \* Great merchants' shop cum residences remain as they were
- \* Japanese sake liquor brewers & distributors
- \* Cotton products distributors
- \* Timber products distributors
- \* Oil distributors (Rape seed oil for lamp)




